(1st Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6; Psalm 22; 2nd Reading: Ephesians 2:13-18; Gospel: Mark 6:30-34)

Compassionate shepherding is the unifying theme of this Sunday's liturgical readings. This is the only kind of shepherding or mode of leadership that is attuned to God's heart and can mediate God's care for His people.

Jesus, the righteous shoot whom God promised to raise to David, is the perfect embodiment of compassionate shepherding. His decisions in today's Gospel are all motivated by compassion. He makes sure that his apostles get their needed rest after their missionary journey. But he himself renounces his time of rest to attend to the crowds that have taken the trouble to come on foot to be with him. The second reading speaks of the climax of Jesus' compassionate shepherding — his death on the cross — as the principle of unity of God's scattered flock.

Lord Jesus, our compassionate Shepherd, protect your terror-stricken sheep from the greed and abuses of plundering shepherds. Amen.


